SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA CHILDREN'S MUSEUM

The <u>Southern California Children's Museum</u> moved into 459 E. Colorado Blvd in the latter part of 2016.

The mission of Southern California Children's Museum (SCCM) is to cultivate a child's wonder, stimulate curiosity, and motivate learning through interactive exhibits, creative experiences, and dramatic play, all while promoting the diverse cultures of Southern California. SCCM's vision consists of four main focuses: Visual Arts, Performing Arts, Culinary Arts, and My California and they are working consistently to enhance the various ways they showcase each of these four focuses through exhibits and programming.

Museum director Jennifer Preston says, "the beauty of Southern California Children's Museum is that although our focus is on the child, parents have an opportunity to let go of the daily grind in order to take a moment to reconnect and recall experiences from their childhood, while also reaping the benefits of play."

Now that the SCCM is here, Preston explained that after outgrowing the previous, temporary location, they were



"excited to find a new space in the Playhouse District that fits their growing needs. This new facility is four times the size of the previous location and has the capacity to accommodate current attendance, exhibits, and programming needs." They report they have had "an exciting year expanding within the space and continue to be inspired by conversations with sponsors, visitors, and advisors about the bright future of SCCM!"

Preston was also keen to discuss what she and her associates like about being located in the Playhouse District. "They feel very fortunate to be part of the lovely Pasadena Playhouse District. The Playhouse District Association (PDA) provides support to businesses by fostering connections and creating a real sense of community. Through thoughtful and fun mixers, open monthly meetings, and various large-scale community events, there are many ways to be involved. In 2016, SCCM offered their space for a well-attended PDA mixer and participated in the Make Music Festival, the Pasadena ARTWalk, and the event to promote local, small businesses in the District. They look forward to contributing an art experience to this summer's upcoming special event, Intersection!"

Chalk Preschool Pasadena

Chalk Preschool, a preschool with activities for young children, plans to open their next location here in Pasadena by June.

Kaiser Permanente School of Medicine

Kaiser Permanente School of Medicine is to be located at 94 S. Los Robles Ave. where Green Street enters the Playhouse District. The first-of-its-kind medical school will be a four-story, 80,000-squarefoot LEED Gold building, expected to break ground in late 2017 with a projected 2019 enrollment for

the first class of medical students. Nealry 200 students will eventually occupy the school, with 100 staff. The school plans to leverage the 14 regional Kaiser medical facilities to stress patient-focused education.

Issues & Advocacy Updates

UNION/EL MOLINO LOT "PARKS AND PARKING" UPDATE

Pasadena Councilmember Andy Wilson has formed an informal working group to explore the possibility of a public park on all or portions of the existing City-owned public parking lot at Union and El Molino. Up until 2012, both the City and PDA had worked extensively on a proposal to develop a new subterranean public parking facility capped with a public park on the site. The working group was convened to resurrect whether such a project is still feasible and how to resolve the long-standing competing demands for the limited amount of land for both public parking and open space. The PDA is sensitive to the needs of merchants, employees and visitors who rely on the current public parking so will continue to engage closely with the hopes of creating a "win-win" situation for the site. The working group will continue to meet and outreach to affected stakeholders over the spring and early summer. Updates will be provided here as well as through PDA Newsroom and/or City updates as the process moves forward.

The mixers provide a time to meet, greet, and network with district neighbors, PDA staff, and City leaders in a relaxed and fun atmosphere.




AMBASSADOR GUIDE PROGRAM IMPROVEMENTS



The PDA's clean and safe programs got a big boost late in 2016 with the arrival of a new vendor who has combined resources to provide a highly visible team who take care of the district's safety patrols and environmental maintenance. The crews have new teal-colored uniforms and a more customerfriendly appearance to help serve as the district's primary interface with businesses, property owners, residents, and visitors. The responses to the new program have been uniformly positive, and new equipment such as a pickup truck, cleaning carts

and our very own pressure washer allow the guides to respond to incidents and be pro-active with maintenance. The crew now operate out of a storefront on Green Street and can deploy at a moment's notice with the right kind of response. For the period January-April 2017, the Ambassador Guides continued their diligence and commitment to staying on top of the growing homeless poulation. They respond to nearly 200 homeless contacts on average each month, while also tackling graffiti and panhandler complaints, as well as a host of cleaning and maintenance activities. The guide team continue to strengthen their coordination with homeless service providers and have been instrumental in getting two chronically homeless individuals into housing.
